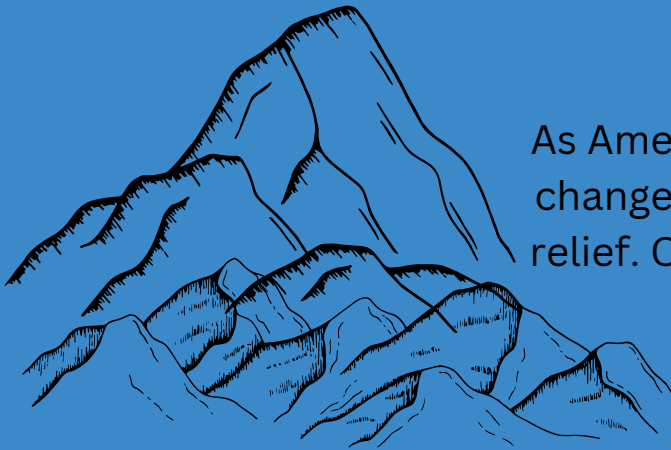

Why the famed Appalachian Trail keeps getting longer - and harder



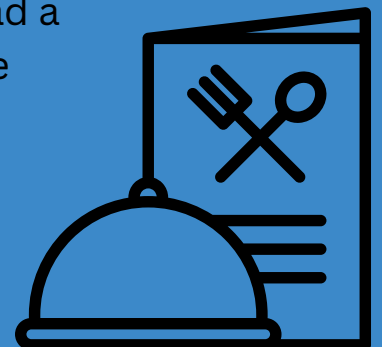
